FIRST WEDDING BANN GRACE MURRAY AND KYLE WEST

Why a wedding bann? In the past, before there was much marriage preparation, publication of upcoming weddings was a means to discover potential impediments to marriage such as prior marriages or being too closely related by blood. Until 1983, all parishes were required to publish upcoming weddings at least three times. Now that couples engage in extensive marriage preparation, the publication of upcoming weddings is no longer mandatory. At St. Paul, we will publish wedding banns as a means to share the joy that fellow parishioners will soon receive the Sacrament of Matrimony.

Were purchased with the blood and sacrifice of others.

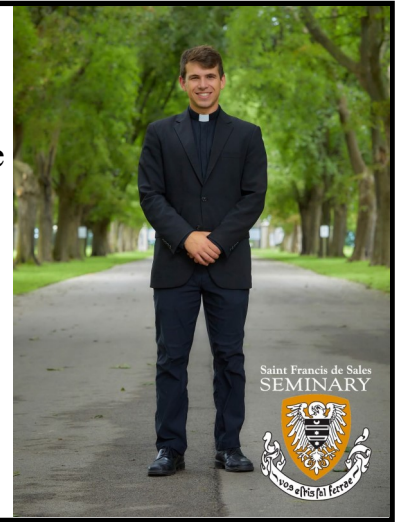

St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
