ECUMENICAL COMMUNITY BONFIRE

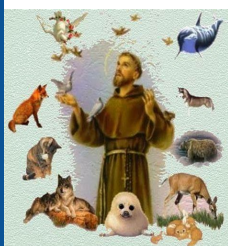

SUPPORT OUR GROWING RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

Did you know that all of the proceeds from store cards purchased through our parish RaiseRight program are used to support our religious education programs? Funds from our RaiseRight program have been used to support the return of Vacation Bible School, the purchase of materials used in our religious education program, and the purchase of materials for adult faith formation. We are very grateful to Kate Drmolka for coordinating our parish RaiseRight program.

People sometimes ask what the “catch” is when purchasing a store card through RaiseRight. There is no “catch”. For example, when a person purchases a Kwik Trip card through our RaiseRight program for \$25, they receive the same \$25 card that they would receive if they purchased the card at a Kwik Trip store. However, by purchasing the card through our parish RaiseRight program, St. Paul receives a commission that comes to us from the store, not from the person purchasing the card. With some cards, people can increase the amount available on those cards online. Our parish receives a commission each time additional funds are added to those cards.

We keep an inventory of the most popular purchases and try to have those cards available each week. St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
