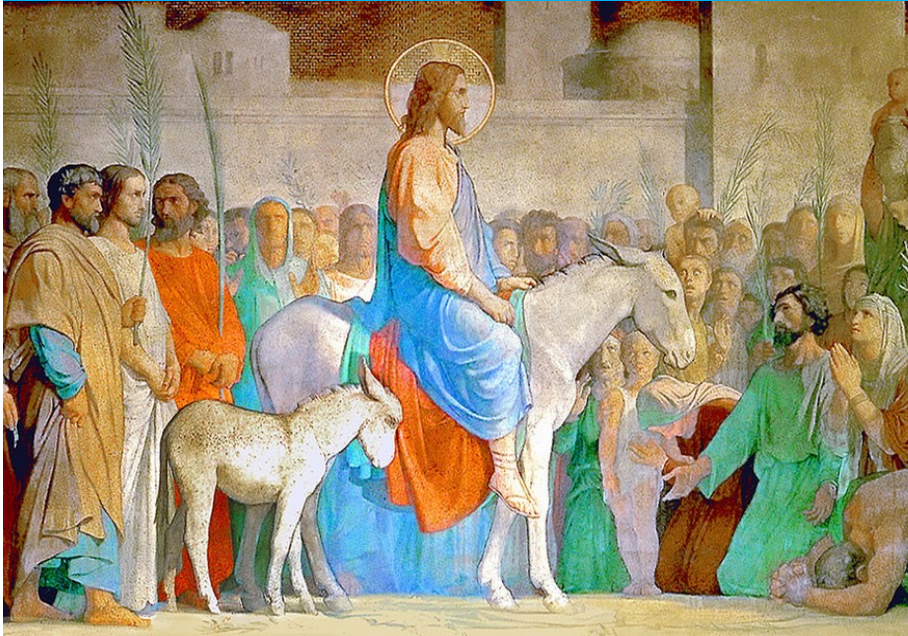

It has been an incredible year. We have 5 amazing teens preparing for their final steps into Confirmation. The rest of these kids have impressed me so much with their knowledge, and curiosity regarding the Catholic faith. I have loved getting to know each one of them as they are here and I look forward to watching their continued growth. Even with only two classes this past month, our students were busy. They participated in the Ecumenical Stations of the Cross, engaged in meaningful conversations about Lent, and some even had a short review of the sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation. Our Confirmation students also attended a retreat at Our Lady of Champion Shrine, the only Vatican-approved Marian apparition site in the United States. One of the students even got to receive Reconciliation at the shrine. We concluded the day praying Vespers with the monks at St. Norbert Abbey and exploring the museum and crypt. It was a joyful day of faith and fellowship.

## **St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information**



**Baptisms:** Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



**Marriage:** Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



**Anointing of the Sick:** Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

**Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services:** Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
