CONGRATULATIONS TO KENDRA DILG

Last Sunday, May 24th, Kendra Dilg was one of 80 adults who received the Sacrament of Confirmation at St. Francis Xavier Cathedral in Green Bay. Several weeks ago, Kendra contacted Dcn. Jim Hoegemeier to inquire about the possibility of being prepared to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation as an adult. Twice a year, the Diocese of Green Bay offers opportunities for adults who have already been baptized, made their first Confession, and received their first Holy Communion, to become fully initiated into the Church through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Kendra and her sponsor, Collin Steiner, met with Dcn. Jim several times over the past two months.

You can see from the photo below that adults of various ages and backgrounds from throughout the Diocese of Green Bay took advantage of the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday. The number of adults in the Diocese of Green Bay receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year is more than double the number from last year! Two Masses - a Pentecost Vigil Mass and the Pentecost Sunday Mass - had to be provided in order to accommodate the number of adults being confirmed, as well as their families and friends.

Dcn. Jim served as Deacon of the Word at the Pentecost Sunday Mass. He proclaimed the Gospel and presented each of the Confirmation candidates by name to Bishop David Ricken.

St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
