MISSIONARY COOPERATIVE PLAN APPEAL

This weekend, our parish members have the opportunity to participate in the annual Missionary Cooperative Plan. This appeal, conducted by the Catholic Foundation of the Diocese of Green Bay, invites thirty-eight groups (selected by Bishop Ricken) to make missionary appeals in every parish throughout our Diocese. All parish receipts collected for this appeal are deposited into one central fund. At the end of the year, the funds are equally divided among the thirty-eight groups. This makes it possible for speakers to come to smaller parishes like St. Paul without fear of receiving fewer contributions than had they visited larger parishes.

The missionaries who are visiting St. Paul are two sisters from the School Sisters of St. Francis. Sister Carol Ann Jaeger, originally from a dairy farm in Wisconsin, has been a School Sister of St. Francis for 65 years. Her experience includes that of a teacher, director of religious education, pastoral associate, and a parish director of two small rural parishes in Wisconsin. After retiring from parish work in Minnesota, Iowa, and Wisconsin, Sister Carol Ann served her community as the Director of Personal Services for her retired Sisters. A few years ago, she made an adult mission trip to School Sister orphanage in Guatemala with a group of people from a previous parish of ministry.

Sister Jincy Vilayappilly is from St. Francis Province (North India). She was received into the community in 1994. She has served our International Congregation as vice president since her election in 2022. She previously served as a formator, teacher, and served a term on her provincial leadership team.

The School Sisters of St. Francis are an international community of sisters who touch and change the lives of people around the world through a myriad of ministries. Founded in 1874, their missions continue to evolve to serve the needs of our times for people who live in poverty and are marginalized by society. Their ministries stretch across the globe from the United States to Latin America, India, Africa, Indonesia, and Europe. Their legacy is one of empowerment and hope.

FESTIVAL RAFFLE TICKETS ON SALE

Tickets for all of the raffles connected to our parish festival are on sale.

50/50 tickets can be purchased from Bob Malek before or after Mass on Sunday, as well as during the festival on Sunday, August 2nd, from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm. 50/50 tickets are 3 for \$10.



Basket and large item raffle tickets can be purchased before or after Mass, as well as during the week when the parish office is open. To purchase the pink basket raffle tickets, sign your name and provide your contact information to a number in the yellow book. This will save you from having to write your contact information on each ticket you purchase. You need only to write your number on each ticket. Place as many tickets as you wish into the cans associated with the baskets you hope to win. Basket raffle tickets are \$1 each, 6 for \$5, 14 for \$10, and 30 for \$20.

To purchase the yellow large item raffle tickets, sign your name and provide your contact information to a number in the yellow book. The same number should be used to purchase both pink raffle basket and yellow large item raffle tickets. Write that number on the yellow tickets you place in the cans associated with the items you wish to win. Large item raffle tickets are \$5 each.

St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
