ADDITIONAL ROLE FOR FATHER JP

When Fr. Sladek served as our Priest Celebrant, he also served as our Priest Moderator. With Fr. JP being new to our country and our diocese, Bishop Ricken gave him a couple of years to settle in before taking on the role of Priest Moderator of St. Paul. We thank Father Tom for his two years of service as our Priest Moderator and welcome Fr. JP to this additional role.

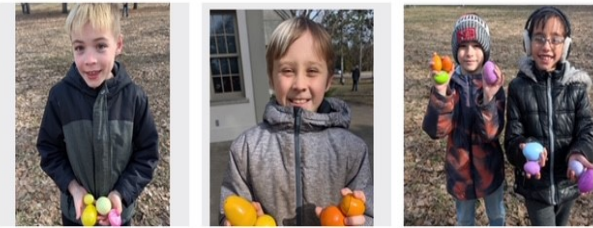
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE

GREETING CARDS MADE BY ST. PAUL'S MISSION TEAM

A wide variety of greeting cards are available on the card rack located on the north side of the parish hall next to the double doors leading to the portico. All proceeds are donated to support the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse. They are very thankful for all the donors who support them and contribute regularly, allowing them to continue their work.

The Salvatorian Mission Warehouse, based in New Holstein, WI, is a project supported by the Salvatorians that works to gather donated relief goods, repackage them to meet the standards of shipping, load them into shipping containers, and send the relief goods to various missions around the world. Everything done at the mission warehouse is done through donations and volunteers.

Each year, the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse partners with several countries and missions to send them relief goods to support their communities. Volunteers fill 40' containers as full as possible, providing people in starving communities a chance to have the lives most of us take for granted.

By purchasing the beautiful cards produced by St. Paul's Mission Team, you not only obtain a card to share for a special occasion; you are supporting God's work by giving to our brothers and sisters in need around the world. St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
