WHAT IS A PRO POPULO MASS?

You may have noticed that the Sunday Mass intention at St. Paul is often Pro Populo, which is Latin for “for the people”. Canon Law, the law of the Church, states that a “pastor is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation.” (Canon 534.1) When a pastor has the care of several parishes, as is the case with Father JP, he “is bound to apply only one Mass for the entire people entrusted to him on the days mentioned.” (Canon 534.2) In our situation, we rotate the Pro Populo Masses between Sacred Heart of Jesus in Poy Sippi, St. Mark in Redgranite, and St. Paul - the three parishes served by Father JP. When the intention of the Sunday Mass at St. Paul is Pro Populo, the Mass intentions at the other two parishes are for people or causes requested by individuals. When the Mass intention at either Sacred Heart of Jesus or St. Mark is Pro Populo, the Mass intention at St. Paul is for people or causes requested by individuals. There is no stipend paid for a Pro Populo Mass.

The purpose of Pro Populo Masses is to ensure that the pastor regularly prays for the collective well-being and salvation of the entire flock entrusted to his care.

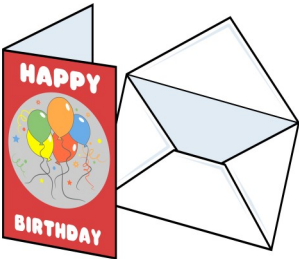
MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY UPDATE



This past week, Catholic Charities of Green Bay hosted a retreat for people interested in Catholic mental health ministry. Catholic mental health ministry provides vital spiritual accompaniment and pastoral care for people experiencing mental health challenges and mental illness, as well as those who care for them. It helps overcome the stigma and discrimination that people living with mental illness encounter in the Church and in human society. Catholic mental health ministry recognizes the value of professional mental health care and the importance of collaboration with healthcare professionals and organizations.

Several members of our parish family, including some who attended the retreat, have already expressed interest in being part of establishing mental health ministry at St. Paul. St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
