WHAT IN THE BELL IS GOING ON AT MASS?

During Mass at St. Paul, bells are rung four times. The first instance is a single ringing of the bells at the epiclesis, when the priest calls on God to send the Holy Spirit upon the gifts of bread and wine that have just been offered and placed on the altar.

The next two instances are similar - they both include a triple ringing of the bells. At the moment when the priest raises the Host, which just became the Body of Christ, the bells are rung three times. Likewise, when the priest raises the chalice with what is now the Blood of Christ, the bells are rung three times. Both instances of the bells remind us that the miracle of transubstantiation, bread becoming the Body of Christ and wine becoming the Blood of Christ, has just taken place.

The fourth ringing of the bells takes place when the priest consumes the Precious Blood. While there is no official or formal guidance, there was a tradition in the early Church that the Eucharistic Prayer was not complete until the priest consumed both the Body of Christ and the Precious Blood.

These instances of bells ringing began for practical reasons. In the early Church, Masses often took place in very dark church buildings which were often crowded with people. It was difficult to see and hear what was going on at the altar. The ringing of the bells at the epiclesis signaled that the Eucharistic Prayer was beginning and something incredible was about to take place. The ringing of the bells during the elevations of the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ signaled that the miracles just took place. The final ringing of the bells signaled the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer.

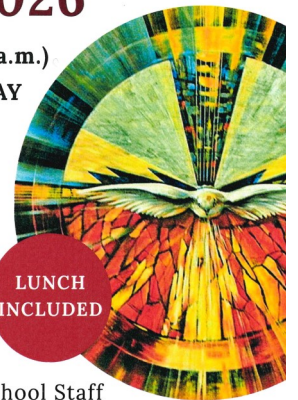

St. Paul Parish Sacramental Information



Baptisms: Parents must be registered members of the parish for at least three months prior to setting a baptismal date, and must complete the baptismal preparation class. Classes will be held at a time that is mutually convenient for the parents and instructor. Please contact the parish office to set a baptism date and register for a class.



Marriage: Couples are asked to notify the parish office at least *six* months in advance. Catholics must be confirmed and active in the faith. Wedding times are to be scheduled no later than 1:00 pm. Even if a couple plan to choose their own vocalist, they are still required to meet with the pastoral leader at least six months in advance.



Anointing of the Sick: Due to medical privacy laws, family members are encouraged to notify the parish of any family members needing a visit, especially Anointing of the Sick. In addition to being available by request, this sacrament is offered after the 8:00 am Mass on the third Sunday of each month.

Policy for Visiting Clergy at funerals and other services: Please inquire in the office if you would like to include clergy from outside our parish. This policy can be applied to any activity here at St. Paul Parish.
